

Thanks to committee member and Treasurer Julian Humphrey who again did an incredible job formulating the club COVID guidelines and we were able to start the season in a safe way. Thanks also to the MWJCA who worked hard trying to get the season underway without the players missing too many games of cricket.



#### Community and fundraising

Pink stumps day was once again a great success. **Darren Kilkeary** and **Ashley Jones** did a fantastic job in organising the day. Thanks to the players, supporters and co-ordinators a total of \$3,313 was raised on the day which was an amazing effort by all involved.

These funds will provide valuable support for the McGrath Foundation Breast Care Nurses ensuring they can continue to provide support to families experiencing breast cancer. Since the MWJCA girl's hub have supported the McGrath Foundation they have raised over \$10,000.

In a first for the Northern Beaches, an all-abilities cricket clinic was held at the Lionel Watts nets from 29 January to 19 February 2022. Between 8.30 and 10.00 across the 4 weekends some cricket skill, laughter and teamwork were on show from all the boys and girls in attendance.

The boys and girls were exceptionally keen, and it was a pleasure for all involved to work with such inspiring cricket enthusiasts. Thanks to **Ben Bryant** at CNSW for arranging and supporting this event, **Michele Hare** for coaching, volunteers **Angela Cameron** and **Deanne Hutt** and to the incredible team at **Blowfly Cricket** for all their knowledge and instruction. This event was the first of many planned clinics. The future of all abilities cricket is a focus of CNSW so watch this space!







#### Wakehurst Redbacks 40th year celebrations

Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions we were unable to hold our Wakehurst Redbacks  $40^{\text{th}}$  year celebrations this season. **Ashley Jones** spent a lot of time organising venues and merchandise for the two planned events. Ashley's work means we will be able ready to hold these events in September/October so stay tuned.

#### New uniforms

We launched the new boys playing uniforms this season. Thanks to Ashley again for getting this off the ground so smoothly. We had 25 JB and 56 MB participating in the entry level programs on a Friday night on the synthetic field at Lionel Watts. However, both programs ran very well and special thanks must go to **Dean Fitsimmons** who co-ordinated the programs ensuring it all ran smoothly on the

night, thanks Dean. Thanks also to **Matt Humphrey** and **Hannah Woolf** who did a great job at co-coaching the Junior Blasters. We had many positive comments on the environment they provided for the first timers to enjoy their first taste of Cricket.

### The Foundation of the Redbacks

The founding of the Wakehurst Redbacks was initiated at the family room table of Bob and Penny Philpott. Bob was the founder of the Redbacks and our inaugural President in the 1981/82 season. Bob co-opted friends, fathers of newly recruited players and anyone else who was prepared to lend a hand, to help him get the Redbacks off the ground.

Back in 1981, the Philpotts were having lunch one late winter Saturday at their home with a couple of their son's friends. The boys who were aged about 8 or 9 were talking about playing cricket in a team, and in a competition. Theirs and Bob and Penny's enthusiasm grew as the meal went on and Bob said: "Ok, you get a team together and I'll coach you". They talked about a name for the team at lunch and the kids wanted a spider as it would be a bit menacing to the opposition. In fact the Funnel-web was their first choice, but the adults said that could be a bit vicious so they all settled on the Redback!

By the Monday afternoon the boys had gathered a team and a meeting was held that same week with all the interested kids and their parents.

And so club history was made - the start of the Redbacks. The Redbacks registered in the Manly-Warringah Cricket Association in 1981 ready for their first cricket season. The first kit was bought from the registration fees and a donation from Bob's friend Mike Pawley.

With Bob as President, a committee was formed with Warwick Brady as the Secretary and Jo Gotting the Treasurer. Warwick was also the official scorer. All involved became a very happy social group where each week after practice, the Mums. Dads and kids all got together for a barbecue. Some great and lasting friendships were formed as a result.

Bob had an outstanding ability to create and build teams, clubs and groups. His other achievements include the creation of the Balgowlah Rugby Club in the 1960s and the Forest Youth Theatre Company in 1985. Bob Lind was involved in

those early days coaching junior teams and he would go on to become President in 1987 for 14 consecutive seasons.

So if this new club wanted to look like they meant business, the Redbacks had to have a logo. Penny worked in publishing and design and created the logo herself at home. The Redbacks logo was then screen printed onto the caps and the back of the shirts. In following seasons when more teams were formed, new badges were made that were sewn onto the shirts. To-



Now, almost 35 years on, the Wakehurst Redbacks has flourished, growing into the wonderful club we have today, thanks to the efforts of Bob Philpott and the many great volunteers who have followed.

#### Junior Blasters

The Junior Blasters cricket program is an entry level format for boys and girls aged 4 to 7 years. Some of these players moved to the Master Blaster competition.

The program ran for 8 weeks from October to March and was designed for participants to build their cricket skills through fun, game-based activities. Each child received a player pack when registering for the program.

An emphasis was placed on learning the basics of batting, bowling, and fielding. The activities were designed in a circuit style format where they would spend 5 to 8 minutes on each activity before they would rotate to the next one.

Now that they have mastered the basics, they will be ready to graduate to Master Blasters where they can play modified games of cricket.

A special thanks to **Matt Humphrey** and **Hannah Woolf** who did a fantastic job at running the program every Friday night. They did a great job of implementing the program and keeping the kids engaged.



#### Master Blasters

The primary focus with this form of cricket is to provide a positive, enjoyable introduction to the game using a variety of activities which develop basic cricket skills, provide physical fitness and encourage social interaction and team building. The children were taught specific skills including holding the bat, catching, throwing and basic bowling and batting techniques.


