

The Foundation of the Redbacks

The founding of the Wakehurst Redbacks was initiated at the family room table of Bob and Penny Philpott. Bob was the founder of the Redbacks and our inaugural President in the 1981/82 season. Bob co-opted friends, fathers of newly recruited players and anyone else who was prepared to lend a hand, to help him get the Redbacks off the ground.

Back in 1981, the Philpotts were having lunch one late winter Saturday at their home with a couple of their son's friends. The boys who were aged about 8 or 9 were talking about playing cricket in a team, and in a competition. Theirs and Bob and Penny's enthusiasm grew as the meal went on and Bob said: "Ok, you get a team together and I'll coach you". They talked about a name for the team at lunch and the kids wanted a spider as it would be a bit menacing to the opposition. In fact the Funnel-web was their first choice, but the adults said that could be a bit vicious so they all settled on the Redback!

By the Monday afternoon the boys had gathered a team and a meeting was held that same week with all the interested kids and their parents.

And so club history was made - the start of the Redbacks. The Redbacks registered in the Manly-Warringah Cricket Association in 1981 ready for their first cricket season. The first kit was bought from the registration fees and a donation from Bob's friend Mike Pawley.

With Bob as President, a committee was formed with Warwick Brady as the Secretary and Jo Gotting the Treasurer. Warwick was also the official scorer. All involved became a very happy social group where each week after practice, the Mums. Dads and kids all got together for a barbecue. Some great and lasting friendships were formed as a result.

Bob had an outstanding ability to create and build teams, clubs and groups. His other achievements include the creation of the Balgowlah Rugby Club in the 1960s and the Forest Youth Theatre Company in 1985. Bob Lind was involved in

those early days coaching junior teams and he would go on to become President in 1987 for 14 consecutive seasons.

So if this new club wanted to look like they meant business, the Redbacks had to have a logo. Penny worked in publishing and design and created the logo herself at home. The Redbacks logo was then screen printed onto the caps and the back of the shirts. In following seasons when more teams were formed, new badges were made that were sewn onto the shirts. To-



day we still sew the foundation logo on to all our caps and the sleeves of our shirts in respect of the club history.

Now, almost 35 years on, the Wakehurst Redbacks has flourished, growing into the wonderful club we have today, thanks to the efforts of Bob Philpott and the many great volunteers who have followed.

Junior Blasters

The Junior Blasters cricket program is an entry level format for boys and girls aged 4 to 7 years. Some of these players moved to the Master Blaster competition.

The program ran for 8 weeks from October to March and was designed for participants to build their cricket skills through fun, game-based activities. Each child received a player pack when registering for the program.

An emphasis was placed on learning the basics of batting, bowling, and fielding. The activities were designed in a circuit style format where they would spend 5 to 8 minutes on each activity before they would rotate to the next one.

Now that they have mastered the basics, they will be ready to graduate to Master Blasters where they can play modified games of cricket.

A special thanks to **Matt Humphrey** and **Hannah Woolf** who did a fantastic job at running the program every Friday night. They did a great job of implementing the program and keeping the kids engaged.



Master Blasters

The primary focus with this form of cricket is to provide a positive, enjoyable introduction to the game using a variety of activities which develop basic cricket skills, provide physical fitness and encourage social interaction and team building. The Opals finished runners-up in 2021/22 but just five members of that team remained, and they were joined by five more girls, including two from other clubs, to form a new collection of Opals.

They would start their season with an emphatic 110-run victory against Beacon Hill, with three of them posting their highest ever score, and that trend continued until the midseason break, when they had overwhelmed every other team in the competition by an average winning margin of 86 runs, including three 100+ run wins.

Asked to bowl first upon the resumption, the girls made light work of Beacon Hill in Round 10, dismissing the Brumbies for 41 runs before reaching the victory target in the seventh over for the loss of just one wicket.

A short-handed Opals suffered their only regular season loss in Round 11 against Harbord Marlins. Asked to bowl first again, they restricted the Marlins to 5/92 but could manage only 5/65 in reply to lose by 27 runs.

The latter part of their season was disrupted, first by a bye in Round 13 and then an opposition forfeit in Round 15, meaning the girls had played just one game in four weeks entering finals.

They batted first in their Semi-Final against Collaroy, scoring a more than competitive 5/90. It was a close, hard fought game and unfortunately Collaroy was able to reach the victory target with one wicket in hand.

While they may not have reached nor won the Grand Final, they are all winners and should be proud of what they achieved throughout the season, collectively and individually. As a whole, they scored 6.94 runs per over during the regular season while conceding just 3.38 runs per over - both ranked No.1 in the competition.

Separately, seven Opals combined to score 14 career-highs with the bat while five claimed seven career bests with the ball, to exhibit the continual improvement within the group.

Tait added three catches, one run out and two run out assists to her stat sheet.

Marley showed significant progress with bat and ball during season 2022/23 compared to previous seasons.
